Aristotle argued that what sets people apart from other living things is their capacity to think and acquire wisdom.

Engaging students in Philosophical Inquiry (PI) helps build collaborative, flexible, independent thinkers with the capacity to innovate and solve problems. These skills will equip them to live and work successfully and more confidently with others.

As life's big questions are explored, respect and reason are developed and practised. By pondering prevailing beliefs, exploring possible alternatives and giving and accepting reasons, students learn to be reflective, sensitive to meaning, divergent and reasonable.

PI is a core subject in Years 7-10 at Hillbrook and is integrated into other subject areas, with Philosophy and Reason offered as a senior subject.
