- The right and responsibility to learn.
- Everyone has the right and responsibility to learn and help others to do the same.



- The right to be accepted, and the responsibility to accept others.
- We give others the freedom to express themselves without fear of being judged. We believe that others have good intentions and act with integrity.

- The right and responsibility to seek to understand ourselves, others and the world around us.
 - We should encourage thinking and questioning in ways that are critical, compassionate and creative.



- The right to form our own friendships, and the responsibility to promote friendships with others.
- We should be present, attentive and show appreciation and care for others.

- The right to be heard, and the responsibility to listen.
 - We have the responsibility to give our full attention by listening, and respectfully responding to the concerns, feelings and experiences of others.

- The right to our individual faith and worship, and the responsibility to encourage each other to discover the spiritual aspects in our lives.
- We recognise that faith and spirituality is an ongoing personal journey.



- The right to belong and the responsibility to help others to experience the same.
- We should treat each other with kindness, good manners and consideration, and help others to be safe, and feel supported and valued.

- The right to our own property, and the responsibility to respect the property of others.
- We should care for our belongings and those of others and not interfere with another's property.

- The right to be treated with respect, fairness and dignity, including the right to our name, and the responsibility to treat others in the same way.
- We should take responsibility for our actions, the language we use, and to treat each other with respect, fairness and dignity regardless of ability, gender, race, age, culture, sexuality or faith.

- The right to a clean and sustainable environment, and a personal and collective responsibility to care for it.
 - We should look for ways to care for all the places and spaces we share.
